One of Victoria's best walks is located in our neighbourhood along the Gorge waterway. Recent development at the eastern end of the park will further enhance this asset. We can hope that in the near future the two sections of the park will be connected with a single path away from the road.

Before proceeding with the new extension to the park, Saanich held several public meetings to test out its proposals with the area residents. It was indicated that improvements would also be made to the existing park extending west to Admirals Road. Since these improvements fall into the category of maintenance they are the responsibility of the Parks Department and do not involve consultation with the community association or residents.

Some thirty years ago the park was created by extending the land from the existing bank. Rock lined wells built protected existing trees along the old bank from the fill used for the extension. The wells also contained a variety of native shrubs and plants. Unfortunately, many of these trees died in the intervening years


3rd GORGE CANADA

As of writing this article, Saanich Parks Department is waiting for a decision from the Provincial Capital Commission on whether there will be extra funding granted to the Waterway Park project. If any additional money is available, it would probably be used for upgrading the public boat launch next to the Canoe and Kayak Club. Any remaining money left over from the grant will be used for grass seeding of the play area this fall, and some plantings on the shoreline.

and only their stumps remained along with native bushes. Recent work in the park removed the stumps, native plants and the wells leaving the path less sheltered from the traffic along Gorge Road. Lower branches of many trees and bushes were removed. I would have preferred leaving things as they they were. Others may agree or disagree.

At present, there is no regular way for residents to learn about and influence the decisions about how the park is managed. I think that we should form an advisory group as part of the Gorge Tillicum Community Association to offer advice to the Parks Department and keep residents informed of proposed changes before they are made. ACTION PLAN, URBAN VILLAGES

During the discussions which occurred over the Local Area Plan update in 1999 and 2000 community members raised concerns about Tillicum and Burnside Roads. These main thoroughfares in our neighbourhood are so dominated by through traffic that they've become unattractive for those of us who live close to the commercial areas. The streetscapes do not invite people to walk, shop and linger in



the commercial zones, and one might even label them ugly! Hence when it came time to highlight 'action plans' in the new Local Area Plan these roadways were clearly priorities. Now with assistance from the municipality the idea of developing 'urban villages' on Tillicum and Burnside is about to begin.

This fall will see the formation of an advisory committee to begin investigating how Tillicum and Burnside Roads might change for the better in the next 3-5years. The advisory committee will be made up of a Saanich Council member, and a representative from each of the engineering, planning and parks departments. Residents of Burnside and Tillicum Rds will each have one representative and the Gorge Tillicum Community Association will have two representatives. Business owners from each of the three commercial areas will round out the committee. It is anticipated that this advisory group will meet in the fall and that an initial public meeting will be held to outline the process and present some initial thinking and examples from other jurisdictions.

We hope that as many people as possible will come out to engage in the public



- Produced and delivered of 3000 community newsletters three times a year.





Each year Saanich Municipal Council appoints Saanich citizens to serve as members of various advisory committees boards, and other organizations.



What would your street look like with more trees? Think about streets you know that are lined with trees. What about Shelbourne Street? Imagine what it would look like without them. What a difference they make! Now imagine your own street with more trees. A group of neighbours on Earl Grey Street did just that. As a result, their section of the street will soon have several new trees.

Bruce Jones and Arden Little recently coordinated a project to take advantage of Saanich's tree planting program. Under this program, the municipality will plant, stake, and water the new trees for five years. The only cost to the neighbourhood is \$50 per tree. Bruce and Arden distributed a flyer with the relevant information and talked to neighbours about the scheme. They were overwhelmed by the positive response. They collected a total of \$650 - enough to pay for 13 new trees, which will be planted in the next few weeks.



In 1992 I began research into the history of the Gorge-Tillicum neighbourhood and the adjacent waterway. Local archives and old newspapers were mined for Gorge references but the most satisfying time was spent interviewing early residents of the area.

Many of the recollections concerned activity on the waterway. One gentleman aged 100 years remembered tipping his canoe in the Gorge rapids enroute from his campsite along Portage Inlet in 1911. The legendary swimmer Audrey Griffin, living on Inez Drive in 1915, could clearly recall winning her first Gorge race in August of that year.

The antics of youth were often remembered such as climbing through the framing of Tillicum School under construction in 1917 or playing in the old quarry at 515 Ker Avenue. When a fire threatened the grand home of Supreme Court Judge David Eberts, at the foot

of Qu'Appelle Street in the summer of 1923 local boys were asked by firemen to dampen an exterior wall with water from a hose too heavy for their size. "We kept it wet allright," recalled one of the excited participants, "and blew off shingles and broke a window or two!" A lady from Albina Street remembered chanting "Get a car, get a car!" as Laura Dunsmuir passed along Gorge Road in her horse and carriage enroute from Hatley Castle in the early 20,s. A man in his ninties told of raiding the henhouse behind Estella Carrol's brothel. then selling the chicken to a butcher along Tillicum Road. One long time resident of Orillia Street remembered wandering through the empty halls of Premier Sir Richard McBride's former mansion on Gorge Road shortly before it's demolition in 1932.

Others recalled more productive

pursuits such as helping dairyman Fred White drive his herd of cows along Obed Avenue and delivering the Colonist newspaper on dark mornings in the winter of 1918 when area streets were lined with slippery wooden sidewalks and streetlights were few.
