1. Adoption of Agenda/ June, 2013 minutes
2. Reports
  - a. Finance – Chris – increase in Vendor fees and decrease in performer fees from picnic – need to work on increasing membership numbers
  - b. Executive Meeting Report- Rob – met August 8 to discuss time sensitive issues
  - c. Membership – Christine – 234 members – renewal stats since April -33% from picnic, 29% from online forms, 16% from mail campaign, 13% from AGM and 8% from newsletter
    - discussion re doing a simple survey of members to see what they're looking for from us, possibility of providing a benefit – should we not mail application forms to those with email? – consensus to not worry too much about mailing costs
    - debate over how many informational emails we should send out
  - d. SCAN/Council – Rob
    - noxious weed bylaw on the agenda
    - Saanich planning wants to revisit LAP process – workshop in November with 5 attendees from each CA
  - e. West Gorge Transportation Committee – Pam
    - work on hold – people watering Cowper/Admirals boulevard plantings have asked us to provide safety vests and cones
    - Motion to spend up to \$400 for bulbs to be planted in boulevard areas MSC
  - f. GWI – (Craig Elder)
    - Saanich would like to decommission the lower path in Gorge Park – Craig would prefer it to be repaired and has asked us to support this – after much debate Rob will contact Craig and craft a response
  - g. GTUF- Gabe – Garden Tour September 21
  - h. Gorge Tillicum Community Table – Gabe
    - Belle Leon has created an art poster – Rob to send Report and Map electronically
3. Parks
  - a. Gorge Park cleanup is this Saturday at 9 – Christine to contact Starbucks

- b. Community Gardens – Gabe
  - there is an opposition group – much support at the Picnic – Transitional Garden Committee is working hard – 10 member
  - possibility of a rain garden – local preference not allowed under Saanich bylaws – there will be a washroom on site
  - Council Committee of the Whole on either October 7, 21 or 28
  - should meet with GTCA Executive asap

- 5. Swim Fest Debrief
  - not much interest from GTCA this year – Rob has informed swim fest folks that we won't be participating next year
  
- 6. Canada Day Picnic – Harry
  - if Gorge on Art participates in future we may need a GTCA coordinator
    - a. Can Day Website – Christine/Marcus
      - launched the end of May – 5000 visits, 1600 on July 1, 40% through the website
  
- 7. Developments-
  - a. Craigflower Bridge- Rob –delayed until March due to welder shortage
    - there is a \$30,000 budget for art that will be administered through a jury
  - b. Craigflower School House Property- Harry, Rob
    - Request for Expression of Interest – we are not interested in managing the property but are very interested in working with whoever is – other interested groups have welcomed this
  - c. Tillicum/HWY, Lasik- Rob – passed at Council
  - d. Silver City Paint- Rob – turned down at Council
  - e. Saanich Senior's Living- Rob – lengthy process approved and will go to public hearing, likely in October
  - f. EY Properties, progress thus far... - Rob – already renting – achieved Green Build Platinum rating
